Successful completion of the Food Protection module completes Phase 1 of certification training, making those employed in a local health department eligible for field certification activities (Phase 2) that are scheduled and conducted by the Connecticut Department of Public Health, and which lead to certification.

Successful completion of the Sewage Disposal module shall meet the eligibility requirements for Level I certification by the Connecticut Department of Public Health, for those employed in local health departments.
